Salt Dough Decorations

Recipe for Salt Dough Easter Eggs or Spring Decor:

- 1 cup flour
- 1/2 cup salt
- 1/2 cup water

Stir together until a dough forms, kneading the dough a couple times

Roll it out 1/4 inch thick and cut out desired shapes (egg shapes, flowers, etc).

Use a straw to cut out holes for hanging.

Bake at 250 for 2 hours.

Then paint and use twine to hang on your favorite spring branch!
