Published in 1953, *Fahrenheit 451* by Ray Bradbury is a dystopian novel that defends the necessity of books and reading to both individuals and society as a whole by bringing to life a society where books are illegal. Bradbury wrote across genres, from small-town fiction to horror to science fiction, including short stories, novels, and screenplays, but with its persuasive illustration of the indispensable impact of literature and critical thinking and the destructive power of censorship and conformity, *Fahrenheit 451* remains his most influential work.

Almost 75 years later, the book's themes, influence, and cultural relevance continue to resonate. This year's Orem Reads—a community-wide reading series sponsored in part by Utah Humanities—will focus on Bradbury's seminal book. Join us at events throughout October to get a free copy of the book and contribute to the conversation.
